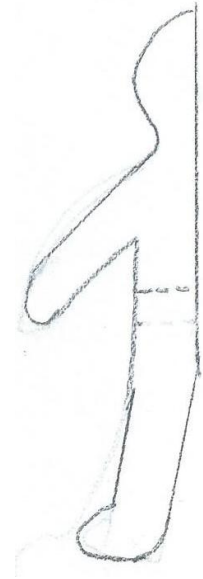




## Quick and Easy Charity Dolls

This doll was designed and tested by Mary Hogan for making simple dolls for charity.

The finished doll is about 15 ½ inches tall.



### Instructions:

#### Prepare Pattern

Make two copies of the pattern and cut out the Body Top and the Body Bottom. Tape together at the dotted lines shown on the pattern pieces. Or you can trace the pattern. The pattern, as you can see, is for half the body and is cut on a fold.

#### Cut fabric

The pattern should be placed on a fold of the fabric and cut out.  
Cut two fabric pieces – a front body and a back body. Place fabric pieces right sides together.

#### Sewing and stuffing the doll body

Leave about 2 inches open on one side of the doll starting about ½ inch below the arm. You will need the opening to turn the doll right side out. Using a ¼ inch seam allowance, sew all around the doll body, except for the opening. Clip curves as needed, e.g., where legs meet, under arms, at the neck, and at the foot. Turn the doll right side out and stuff with polyester fiberfill. Sew the opening up by hand.

Your doll is done!
